

Facility

Entrance into the venue (Main door facing Brooklyn Blvd)

- There will be a room to left, as soon as you enter that can be used for a private changing area.
- Lunch will be served in the room to the right of the entrance.
- There will be an additional room designated for teams to eat and/or relax, which will be directly across from the arcade, just past the concessions area.
- There will be no chairs allowed in the areas behind the bowlers, commonly used as the walkway.
 - Spectators will have standing room only. Seats provided in the bowling area are for the bowlers and coaches.



Tournament Information

- Registration begins at 7:45am. (Payment for pre-ordered lunches must be paid for by check at registration. Participating school envelopes should be picked up at this time also.)
- Warm-ups for Singles: 8:45am, Doubles: 12:00pm, and Teams: 2:30pm
- Start times for Singles: 9:00am, Doubles: 12:15, and Teams: 2:45pm (Awards to follow immediately after each competition.)
- Lunch Break: Starts at 11:00am


Coaches Expectations

- Make sure that there are not too many kids on the lanes, that are not actively bowling. Only the current bowlers should be on the lanes and in that area. Please find a designated spot for participants while they are waiting for their time.
- Report Scratches to Tournament Staff located at the main desk.
 - Please also keep your bowlers on task and ready to bowl at all times.
- The electronic scoreboard is the official score. If you have a problem with the lane, please consult with the bowling alley personnel.
- PI bowlers: Coaches may assist students in chairs and/or in need of a ramp. One assistant per bowler on the lane is allowed. The assistant can place the ramp on the lane, but final adjustment must be directed or completed by the bowler. The assistant may steady the ramp if needed. Assistants must not interfere with bowlers in the adjacent lanes.
- Coaches/Schools will be asked to verify their participant's bowling scores with handicaps near the MSHSL
 Tournament Headquarters prior to the event awards ceremony. Please be prepared to verify scores.

MINNESOTA STATE HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE

These policies "elevate standards of sportsmanship and encourage the growth of responsible citizenship among the students, members schools and their personnel," consistent with the Minnesota State High School League's Founding Purposes and the belief that sportsmanship needs to have a constant presence in all school-based activity programs. The League and its member schools work intentionally to create safe, welcoming and inclusive environments for fine arts activities and sports in our schools and competitions.

School officials are responsible for the proper conduct of teams, team members, students, and home spectators regardless of where the contest is being held. (Bylaw 409).

Behavior Expectations

- To create safe, welcoming and inclusive environments in fine arts and sports in our school and competitions, I will:
- Lead by positive example and demonstrate respect and support for others.
- Follow all MSHSL, school and venue expectations.
- Refrain from using profanity or ethnic, racial, religious, ability or gender-based comments, posts or messages directed at
 participants, directors, coaches, officials, spectators, or team representatives.
- Act as a responsible and respectful digital citizen who positively uses social media platforms
- Speak or act in support of others when they are harmed by words or actions.
- Honor each contest and all involved, including participants, directors, coaches, officials, spectators, and team representatives
- Hold high standards for myself, engage positively and demonstrate sportsmanship

Requirements of Attendees

Prohibited Items

- Flags, whiteboards, large signs on sticks, signs with vulgar, obscene or inappropriate language or images, or that obstruct the
 views of others or similar items
- Balloons, confetti, glitter, baby powder, pom poms or other similar celebratory items
 Artificial noise makers (i.e., megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks and other similar items)
- Drones and laser lights
- Firearms or other weapons
- Vapes, alcohol, tobacco, cannabis or illicit drugs
- The following are prohibited at MSHSL postseason events. These may be prohibited as determined by the venue during the regular season:
 - Backpacks and other bags

Outside food and drink

Cameras and tripods Sess Code/Attire

Spectators may not wear masks or costumes that limit the ability to identify individuals. Masking for medical purposes is

- allowed
- Spectators must wear clothing that covers the torso
 Clothing worn must not be vulgar, obscene, or inappropriate

ehaviors

- No one may interfere with the contest in any way
- Only members of the official squad may be on the contest surface
- The use of appropriate language is always expected. Profanity, negative chants, booing, trash talk, name calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable
- Respect the Flag and the National Anthem

*Venues may have additional requirements and prohibited items
